

Looking ahead to the outdoor season

As the busy month of March draws to a close, athletes are already gearing up for the peak of an action-packed outdoor season.

The first Gold level meeting on the [World Athletics Continental Tour](#) will soon get under way as Bermuda hosts the opening meeting in the series on 9 April. The [Wanda Diamond League](#), meanwhile, kicks off just five weeks later when Doha hosts the traditional curtain-raiser on 13 May. And the first outdoor meeting of the year on the [World Athletics Combined Events Tour](#) is due to take place at the end of April with the Multistars meeting in Grosseto.

All of the roads on these tours, of course, will naturally lead to the [World Athletics Championships Oregon22](#) from 15-24 July.
