

Looking ahead to the World Athletics Indoor Tour

Just four weeks into the new year, the [World Athletics Indoor Tour](#) is already in full swing.

The first Gold level meeting in the series took place in Karlsruhe on 28 January and it was followed 24 hours later by the Millrose Games in Manhattan, New York. There are five more Gold meetings in the series, all of which lead into the [World Athletics Indoor Championships Belgrade 22](#).

Many of the world's best athletes are aiming to compete in the Serbian capital between 18-20 March for the first of two global senior track and field championships being held this year.

Searchable by event, country and qualification status, the tool provides a real-time view of each event over the course of the qualification period, which ends on 26 June 2022 (29 May 2022 for the marathon and 35km race walk).
