

Looking ahead to Copenhagen and major marathons

With the indoor season now concluded for another year, the focus of the athletics world turns to road running, and in particular the **IAAF/AL-Bank World Half Marathon Championships** on 29 March. Held in the Danish capital Copenhagen, this year's event will also provide the opportunity to the masses of running alongside the world's best athletes in a '**Run with the champions**' mass-participation race held alongside the elite events.

It was **recently announced** that five-time winner Zersenay Tadese will be in Copenhagen to defend his title. We also took a look at **some key facts and figures** ahead of race day.

With some exciting races expected, the IAAF World Half Marathon Championships will whet the appetite for the major spring marathons, including those in Boston and London.

Away from the roads, the **IAAF World Challenge recently got underway in Melbourne**. The 15-meeting series continues in little more than a month at the Jamaica International Invitational in Kingston.

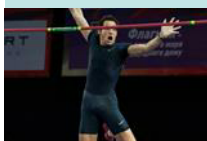

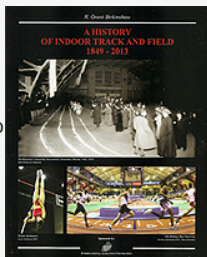
